Types of Financial Aid

- **Grants and Scholarships:** Free money that does not have to be repaid
- **Work-study:** Sponsored work program that enables students to earn money while in school
- **Loans:** Borrowed money that must be repaid with interest
 - Stafford Loans: Subsidized, Unsubsidized
 - PLUS Loan
 - Private Loans

About the FAFSA

- FAFSA stands for **Free Application for Federal Student Aid**. The FAFSA is typically used to determine eligibility for:
 - Federal aid
 - State aid
 - Much of the aid that colleges distribute
 - Many private scholarships
- Complete the FAFSA as early as you can, as some forms of aid are distributed on a first-come, first-serve basis
- **Expected Family Contribution (EFC)**: An index number that financial aid staff used to determine how much financial aid you would receive to attend their college





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Special Circumstances

The following circumstances would NOT be considered as a special circumstances on their own:

- You do not live with your parents (*You should still reach out to your parent and ask them to send pictures of their financial information*)
- Your parents don't provide you with financial support
- Your parents refuse to contribute to your college expenses
- Your parents don't claim you as a dependent on their income tax return
- Your parents do not want to provide their information on your FAFSA
- Your parents live in a foreign country (*You will indicate that a "Foreign Country" is your parent's state of legal residence, select "Foreign tax return" when asked about type of income tax filed, and estimate your parents' 2019 wages in US Dollars*)

You must contact the financial aid offices at the colleges you plan to apply to if you still believe you have a special circumstance that will prevent you from providing your parent's information on the FAFSA.

Parent FAQs

- A legal parent includes only a biological or adoptive parent
- Grandparents, foster parents, legal guardians, older brothers or sisters, widowed stepparents, and aunts and uncles **are not considered parents** unless they have legally adopted you
- For students whose parents have never married, are separated, or divorced (and not living together), the parent with whom you have lived the most over the past 12 months is referred to as **the custodial parent**
- If your custodial parent is remarried, you will need to list both the information of your custodial parent and stepparent
- If your parents are unmarried but are still living together, you will list the both of your parents' information

Parent Marital Status

- If you select “Never Married,” “Divorced or Separated,” or “Widowed,” you will be asked to identify which parent is the custodial parent
- If you select “Married or Remarried” or “Divorced or Separated,” you will need to list the month and year of marriage, divorce, or separation

After the FAFSA - Apply for a Scholarship



Apply for a Scholarship through the Scholarship Fund of Alexandria beginning in November.

- Only awarded to Alexandria City Public Schools students in their Senior year
- All students who meet the minimum GPA are eligible to apply
- Financial need awards are a minimum of \$3,000/year
- Scholarships can be renewed for each year of college for a minimum total of \$12,000 over four years
- The application is competitive, but about half of all applicants receive a scholarship
- We also administer some scholarships for students who don't demonstrate financial need, but they typically have other criteria attached to them
- The SFA only fundraises for scholarships for students with financial need

The SFA awards over \$1 Million in Scholarships each year!!
