Our thanks to **Rangena Hotaki** for her willingness to share her story and success with all of us.

**MY NAME IS RANGENA HOTAKI** and I am a proud graduate of Alexandria City High School, award recipient and donor. My family arrived in the United States from Kandahar, Afghanistan, in 1983 and had the good fortune of moving to Alexandria, VA in 1988. There were altogether 12 households in the Landmark area—grandparents, aunts, uncles and cousins—with all of us children enrolled in Alexandria City Public Schools. I went through William Ramsay, Francis C. Hammond and Alexandria City High School, graduating in 1996.

Our journey to achieving the American dream was not easy. My parents worked in hotels, washing dishes and cleaning rooms. On the weekends, they cleaned people's homes, never making more than \$30,000 per year with a household of six. We were never hungry, thankfully, and had family and community support.

My options for college were limited and while I worked very hard, navigating the system as the first of my 63 first cousins to apply to college was no easy feat. I enrolled in the University of Virginia on August 25, 1996.

I graduated in 2000 with a Bachelor of Arts in Economics and Spanish, with minors in

**MOST OF US GO TO A NEW SCHOOL when we enter high school. What about a school in a new country learning in a different language? How would you proceed—how would you succeed? Quite a number of 2023 SFA award recipients are born outside of the US and some do not speak English as their first language.**

“Thanks to this help that I received, I will be able to fulfill my dream of being a bilingual social worker so that I can help children who come to this country and feel alone and misunderstood. Thanks to my personal experience and how my social worker helped me when I arrived in this country, I knew I wanted to do something similar or the same with my life. I would very much like to achieve a high level of studies in this career so that I can help not only school children but also children from the whole city and if I could from the whole country.”

Chemistry and Religious Studies. I joined the dotcom era boom in information technology consulting—the earned income enabling my family to purchase a home together in Fairfax, VA. Over the next six years, I ensured that my three siblings would graduate from college and obtain gainful employment, and take over the household expenses. This was then my opportunity to enroll in Harvard Business School in 2006, graduating with a Masters in Business Administration in 2008. I started my own federal contracting business in 2021 and currently live with my husband, Larry and our two children, Samira and Rafiq in Vienna, VA.

Two critical factors spurred my academic and career success. The first is my father who fought deep-seated cultural programming to simply allow me to attend college! Thanks to my father's initial encouragement, most of my first cousins living in the US also graduated from college.

The second factor is the Scholarship Fund of Alexandria. As a student, I understood what was expected of me, but I had no knowledge of the college admissions process—from SATs to FAFSA, it was all unknown territory. At that point in our journey, most adult members of my family

could not read English, and I was generally responsible for reading mail, writing bills, filling out forms and applications, even doing our annual taxes. I literally could be found every single day in the SFA offices, getting help on which colleges to apply to and most importantly, how to pay for it all. One of the SFA reps in the office encouraged me to apply to UVA, which I believed was

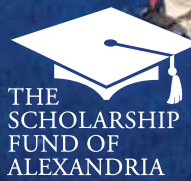

a big reach for me. However, I was accepted. I would have never applied had she not encouraged me.

The SFA awarded me with the Larry Trice PTSA/SCA Scholarship totaling \$10,000 over four years resulting in me finishing college with only \$2,500 total in student loans. This was a phenomenal help to me!

Now I give back in different ways—with cash donations, as a Portrait of Success, participating in SFA ceremonies, and also by attending the annual SFA gala and auction. Most recently, I established a scholarship in honor of my late father, Rahmatullah Hotaki,

who lifted me up against all odds.

I do not believe that my story is unique for ACPS families. The population served is so diverse and rich in culture, language and ethnicities with an array of countries represented. Most importantly, there is a variety of socioeconomic groups represented including the underprivileged and under-served. I do believe SFA is a rare gem in the state of Virginia and, more broadly, in the U.S. During my time at UVA and HBS, no matter how many people I

asked, I never encountered another student who received any sort of financial aid from their public high school. As you can see, the mission and efforts of the SFA had an enduring impact on my family, both nuclear and extended, well beyond the four years of scholarship funding that I received. ❖

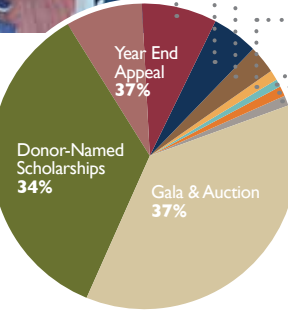
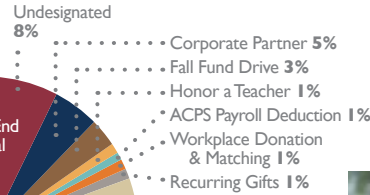

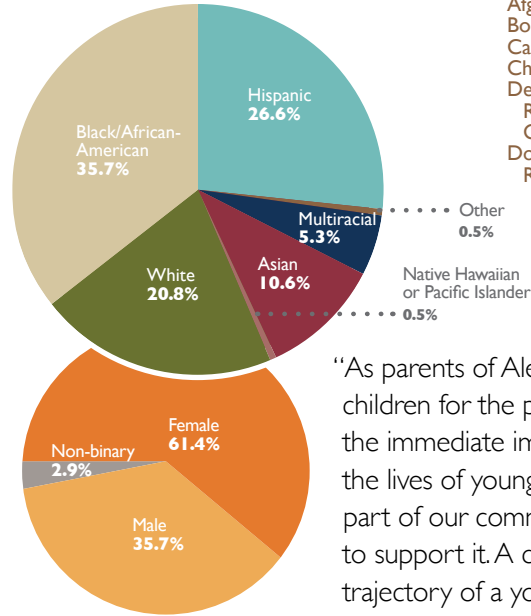

was able to graduate from Virginia Tech with only a small loan used to cover my living expenses as a student teacher. It was a blessing to know that I did not have the burden of paying back thousands of dollars in school loans years after graduating.

As an ACPS employee of nearly 29 years, I always mention my experience and the incredible opportunity that awaits ACHS students who are eligible to apply for a life changing award. I have one former student who told me that her award literally saved her life. After her freshman year of college, she wasn’t sure if she would be able to return due to the cost of tuition that she knowingly would not have for her sophomore year. After a request for additional money was granted, that student ultimately graduated and is a very successful government contractor.
